IGES MRV Capacity Building for New Market Mechanisms in the Philippines for FY2013

To develop an MRV (measurement, reporting and verification) methodology for potential emission reduction project with a view to be utilized under the new market mechanisms

The Institute for Global Environmental Strategies (IGES) is conducting capacity development on Establishing New Market Mechanism through the Development of Methodological and Institutional Framework for Monitoring Reporting and Verification (MRV). The objective of the activity is capacity development on MRV to support the new market mechanisms including Clean Development Mechanism (CDM) and the Joint Crediting Mechanism being proposed by the Government of Japan.

The activities of IGES last year included a capacity building workshop on the new market mechanism, research on the potential projects in the Philippines and a paper on CDM experiences in the Philippines and lessons learned.

IGES has identified renewable energy, energy efficiency and transport as the target sectors in the Philippines. The research documented the potential of these target sectors in generating greenhouse gas emissions reduction and provided recommendations on how the Philippines can effectively participate in the new market mechanism.

The paper on CDM experiences presented the status of CDM implementation in the Philippines, analyzed the barriers it faced, and looked at the impacts of these barriers in the CDM process. From this perspective, recommendations were drawn to enable better participation of the Philippines in the new market mechanisms.

The workshop on the new market mechanism for climate change mitigation was held last 21 February 2013 at the EMB Air Quality Training Center, DENR Compound. The event was a joint workshop to disseminate information on the new market mechanism and provide updates from the Designated National Authority (DNA).
